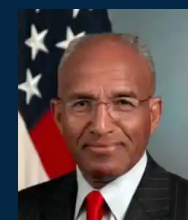

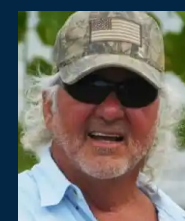

Respite



Care and Support for our veterans and their caregivers.

Wounded Warriors Family Support's Respite Care Program for the Caregiver and Veteran provides respite and supplemental services nationwide to the caregivers and families of wounded war veterans. Our program aims to ensure that family members who were thrust into the role of caregivers are provided with the support they need to keep their families intact while keeping themselves healthy.

Wounded Warriors Family Support's Respite Program focuses on injury, illness and medical events in the family including those of the veteran, the caregiver, and the dependent children. It may include services such as housekeeping, meals, transportation and skilled nursing as deemed needed by our case management. The program also provides assistance with other agencies offering resources and support.

In 2024, the Mobility is Freedom program grew with continued partnerships with the Driver Rehabilitation Center of Excellence and many other nonprofits who assist with identifying veterans in need of custom, mobility-equipped vehicles. Major advancements in vehicle technology are also assisting our disabled veterans in amazing ways to help them operate their vehicles safely.

Welding Training

UAW-Ford and Wounded Warriors Family Support collaborate to provide a job training program in welding for U.S. military veterans. UAW-Ford offers six-week training classes where qualified veterans train and test for 1 G through 6G welding certification. The program prepares participants for apprenticeships and entry-level positions throughout the country in industries such as automotive, ship building, and construction fields.

WWFS trained 28 veterans in 2024. These classes included many female veterans. During the calendar year, \$428,544 was invested in the Welding Training program.



Programs

Soldier Support

Soldier Support provides veterans and their families with unmet needs through direct support for utility payments, emergency funding, travel grants, educational grants, & natural disaster assistance. These needs vary by family and circumstances.

We improve the quality of life for military families and help “fill the gaps” for services not provided by the Department of Veteran Affairs and other organizations. Additional support was provided in 2024 to Dunham House to provide housing for combat-wounded veterans.

During the 2024 calendar year, \$1,504,745 was spent on Soldier Support and unmet needs.

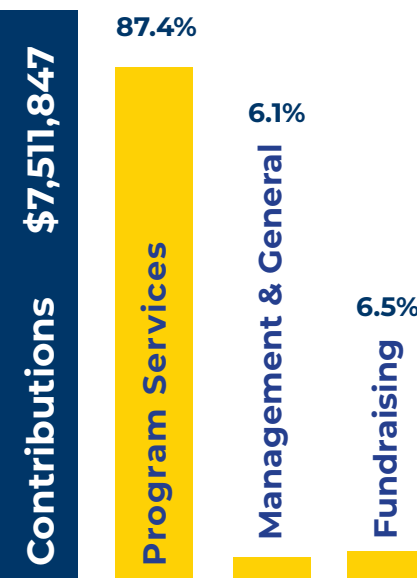

The Dunham House will provide combat-wounded veterans with top-level care and a supportive community where they can live with dignity and independence.



Wounded Warriors Family Support broke ground on the Dunham House this May. At Dunham House, combat veterans' assisted living services will change lives for those who've bravely served our country, by offering a supportive and compassionate home.

Centrally located in Omaha, NE, the combat veterans assisted living facility will provide personalized care tailored to the unique needs of wounded veterans, particularly those with traumatic brain injuries or other polytrauma conditions. We believe every veteran deserves a place where they can heal, thrive, and feel valued.
